2026 is the Fund's most successful year ever!

This year's awards to 67 Gallipoli Scholars represents a huge increase from 35 last year, and a steady increase from around six annual scholarships a decade ago. This growth is entirely due to the hard work of our voluntary Management Committee, our voluntary Scholar Selection Sub-Committee, the tireless work of our Business Development Officer, and the commitment from our voluntary Goodwill Ambassadors and non-academic mentors. Of course, this growth would not be possible without the tremendous support from our growing band of generous donors and supporters.

The Fund is honoured to have our Governor-General as our Patron-in-Chief, and we sincerely thank our Patrons for their unwavering support. Their commitment is very much appreciated.

I congratulate this year's Gallipoli Scholars – the 40 new 1st year students joining our growing Alumni, and the 27 continuing their studies. We, your non-academic mentors, and your generous bursary provider are here to assist you, but you need to remain in contact with us.

Since the first two Gallipoli Scholars were awarded in 1998, the Fund has grown and continues to grow. I am certain that the Gallipoli Veterans who founded the Fund in 1996 would be very satisfied with their legacy over the past 30 years.

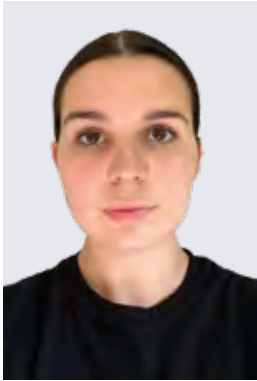


Matilda Conner

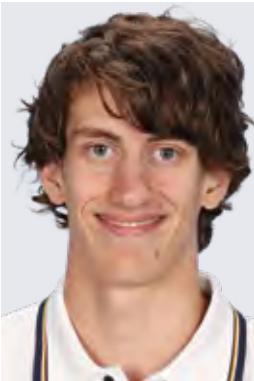

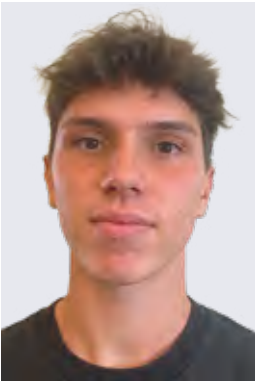


Imogen Hawkins

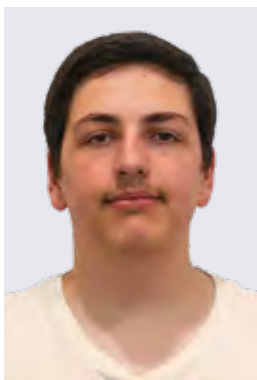
Francesca Morton

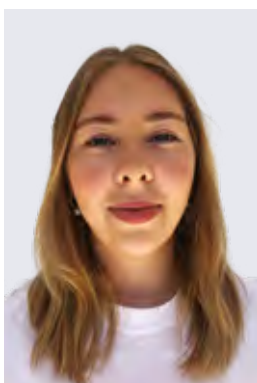
Alice Fergusson

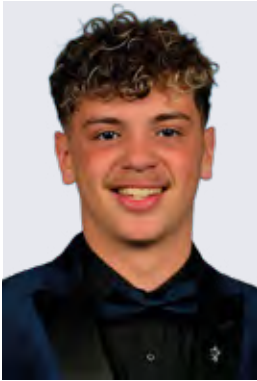
Mason Bentley

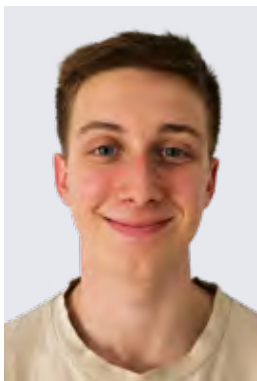


Jackson Coaby

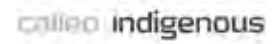
Jai Nabb
